

Stableford competition for all.

Each group to contain one experienced golfer, who will mark the card for that group.

Maximum handicaps for all non-golfers. That's 36 for men, 40 for women.

Regular stableford points scoring. 1 for a net bogey, 2 for par, 3 for birdie etc.

For those who have played before, honest handicapping please. Mines 24, yes 24, I was never better than that when I actually played lol.

I'll get Kerry to send me a scorecard.

To help the day along, if you have no chance of scoring points on a hole, please pick up your ball and progress to the next hole. We may not be the only group out that day, and there's nothing more frustrating than slow play. Also, if there is a group behind you that is waiting, please let them play through.

To give everyone a chance we will all have a team competition. The best net score on each hole in a group will "win" that hole, and the group that wins the most holes will get the team prize.

Usual side competitions, longest drive (man and woman) and nearest the pin, on nominated holes. Nearest the pin in two shots for non - golfers.

Suggested "sides" for non - players.
